§7-301 FIRE PREVENTION; OPEN BURNING BAN.

- (1) No outdoor burning of any kind, character or type shall be allowed except in the following instances:
 - (A) Charcoal braziers or gas fire cooking units used in connection with picnics and/or outdoor cooking.
 - (B) Any burning done by the city volunteer fire department in connection with training courses.
 - (C) A person may kindle or maintain a bonfire upon obtaining a permit to do so from the Fire Chief, and subject to the following conditions:
 - 1. The fire shall be more than 25 feet from any structure, power lines or overhead obstructions, and adequate provision shall be made to prevent the fire from spreading to within 25 feet of any structure, power lines or overhead obstructions.
 - 2. The permits issued pursuant to this section by the Fire Chief shall be subject to rules and regulations promulgated the City and in effect on the date of issuance. The Fire Chief may, from time to time, amend such rules and regulations as it deems necessary and proper. Any rules and regulations in effect on the date of issuance shall be provided to the permit holder in writing as a part of the permit.
 - 3. The Fire Chief may ban and prohibit any of all burning when atmospheric conditions or local circumstances make such fires hazardous.
- (2) Burning of waste materials by incinerator, stove or oven is prohibited unless the stack emissions from such incinerators shall be in conformity with the state department of environmental quality regulations. (Ord. No. 1288, 8/15/95; Ord. No. 1603, 04/20/04)
