

The reading logs may be returned any time after June 20th. They will also receive a ticket for every hour they read. These go into the grand prize drawing. All participants will receive a prize package with coupons for food, tickets for admission to fun places and little prizes. If the log is completely filled out, children will be able to make a reading t-shirt using our new heat press.

Elementary programs will be held on Tuesday afternoons at 1:30 pm. Programs include making bee houses, enjoying a shark party which includes digging for shark teeth, a magic show and Wildlife Encounters (the only program that begins at 10:30 am). 




Registration is now open through the kick-off. We'll have a month of programming for preschool and elementary-aged children. There is no cost for participating but registration is required so we can

What is a BioBlitz? A BioBlitz is an event where people try to find and identify as many plants and animals as they can in a specific area in a short time.

For our BioBlitz, we'll be focusing on the south part of the Doane campus, from 9 am to noon. All members of the community are invited to attend. We're encouraging people to download the free iNaturalist app from Google Play or the Apple store and sign up for a free account ahead of the event. Using the app on our phones, we'll take pictures of the different plant and animal species we see around us and submit them to the iNaturalist website.

Don't worry if you aren't able to recognize many plants and animals yourself; the iNaturalist app will help with identification. The pictures we take can then be used by scientists and other researchers in their study of different species and the natural world. And if you don't have a cell phone or digital camera, there will be other ways to help out and contribute. The main reason for our BioBlitz is to get people outside and enjoying nature.
