Release of All Claims

1. I am duly aware of the risks and hazards that may arise through participation in the Crete Community Garden, and assume any expenses and liabilities I incur in the event of an accident, illness or other incapacity. If I have any questions about the Crete Community Garden, its nature, risks or hazards, I will contact the garden coordinator and discuss those questions or concerns with him/her to my satisfaction.

2. In consideration of being granted the opportunity to participate in the Crete Community Garden, I, for myself, my executors, administrators, agents and assigns do hereby release and forever discharge the Garden Coordinator, volunteers, other gardeners the cooperating landowner and the City of Crete from all claims of damages, demands, and any actions whatsoever, including those based on negligence, in any manner arising out of my participation in the activity. I understand that this Release means that, among other things, I am giving up my right to sue for any such losses, damages, injury or costs that I may incur.

I represent and certify that my true age is either 18 years old or older, or, if I am under 18 years old on this date, my parent or legal guardian has read and signed this form. I have read this entire Release, fully understand it, and I agree to be legally bound by it.

GARDEN RULES

1. Assignment of garden plots will be awarded by a first come, first serve system. Preference for next year's plots will be given to the previous year's participants. No plot rentals will take place after June 1.
2. Plot fees are due in full before the garden season begins. Each gardener must complete a Release of all Claims form before any work in the garden can begin.
3. Each plot owner will receive the combination to the shed lock with their plot payment. Please lock the shed and return all tools and close garden gate when done working.
4. Each gardener is responsible for the maintenance and upkeep of their garden plot. Watering, weeding, harvesting and any other garden related maintenance are all the responsibility of the gardener. Gardeners may arrange for other gardeners to water their plots.
5. Garden plots should be cared for at least once a week. It is the gardener's responsibility to notify the coordinator if he or she is not able to care for their plot in any given week. If any plot remains unattended for more than three weeks, that plot is subject to reassignment.
6. The application of herbicides (weed killers) to the garden plots is prohibited.
7. Children are welcome in the garden but must be accompanied by an adult and must be supervised at all times.
8. At the end of the growing season, gardeners are responsible for clearing their plot of all plant material and leaving the plot as they found it in the spring. At that time, the deposit can be returned.
9. The Garden Planning and Management Committee is responsible for ensuring that rules are followed at all times.

Applications are available by March 1 each year.

GARDEN INFORMATION

Location: The garden is located south of the intersection of 10th Street and Thornwood Ave. in southwest Crete. The garden is fenced with an entrance gate and parking area. Amenities available to garden participants include a shed stocked with basic gardening tools, water hydrant, potting tables and benches, tomato/plant cages, and compost bins.

Plot Size & Cost: Individual garden plots typically measure 7 feet by 12 feet and are rented for the season at \$25 each. Gardeners may rent additional plots at \$20 each. A \$20 deposit per gardener is returned to those who abide by garden rules (see reverse) and participate in a fall clean up of their plots.

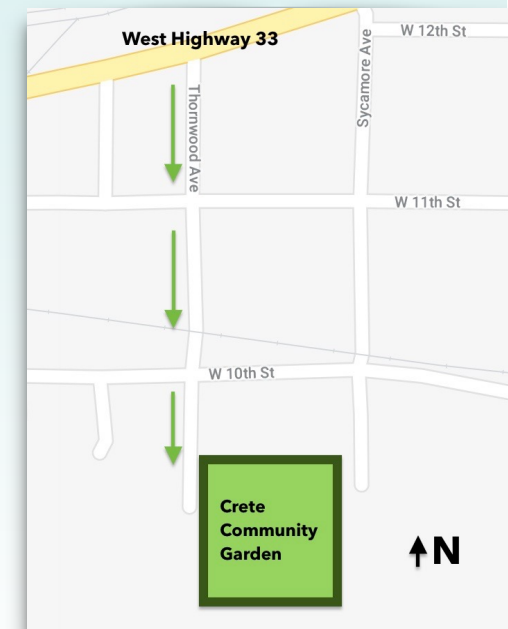
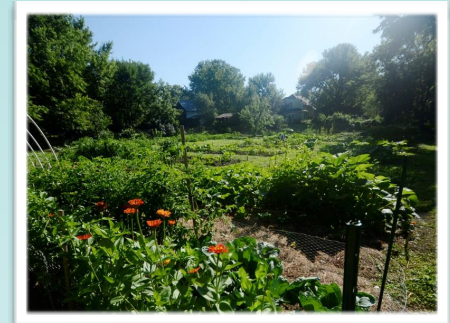
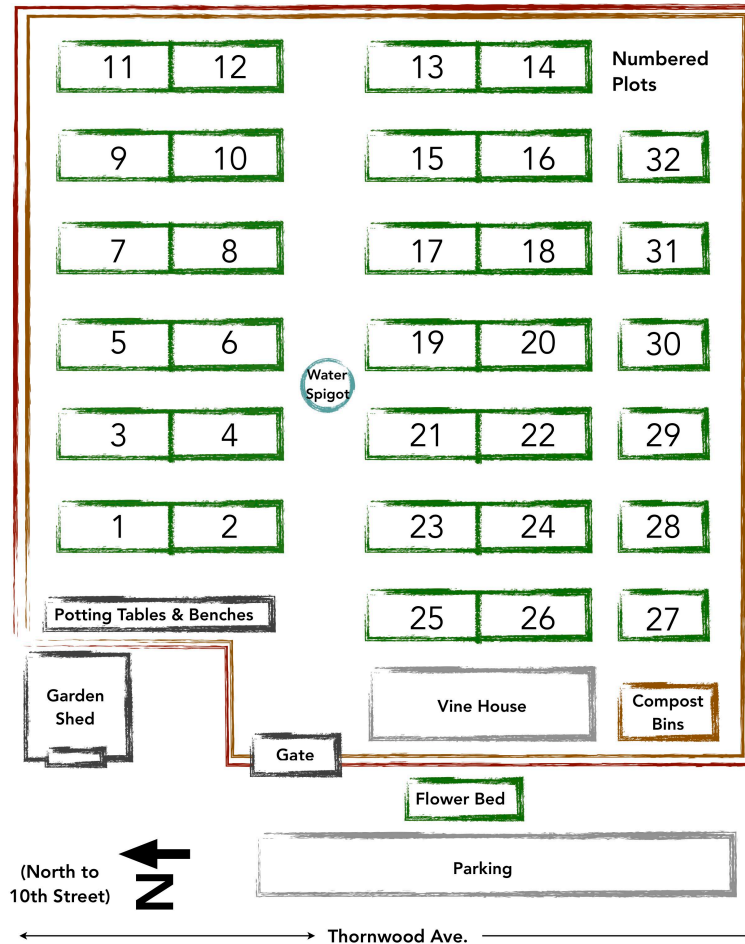

May 1: Gardeners can begin planting (or earlier based on individual request). Some seeds may be available in the garden shed.

June 1: All plots assigned.

Nov. 30: All plants removed and plots cleaned; deposits returned contingent on clean-up.



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
